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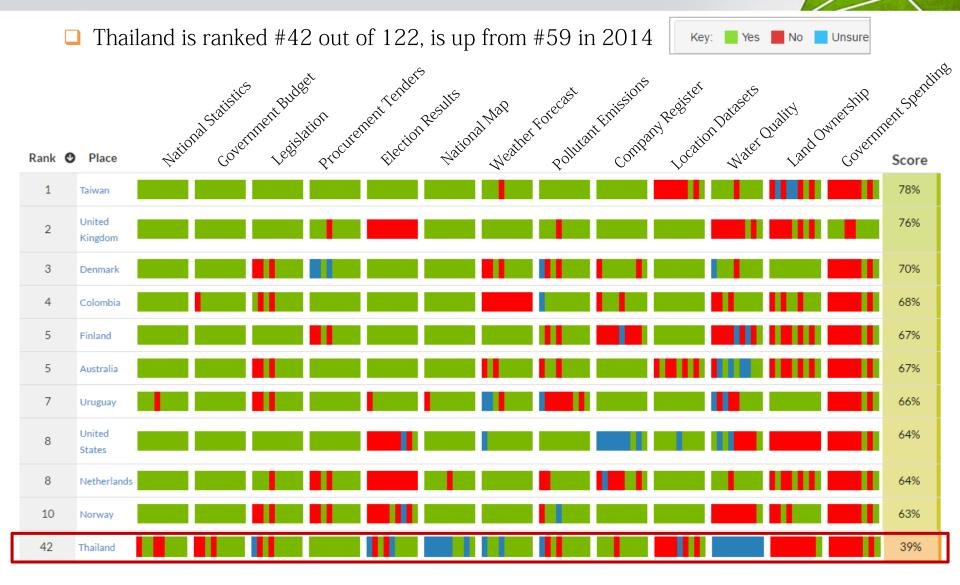

The 8 Principles of Open Government Data

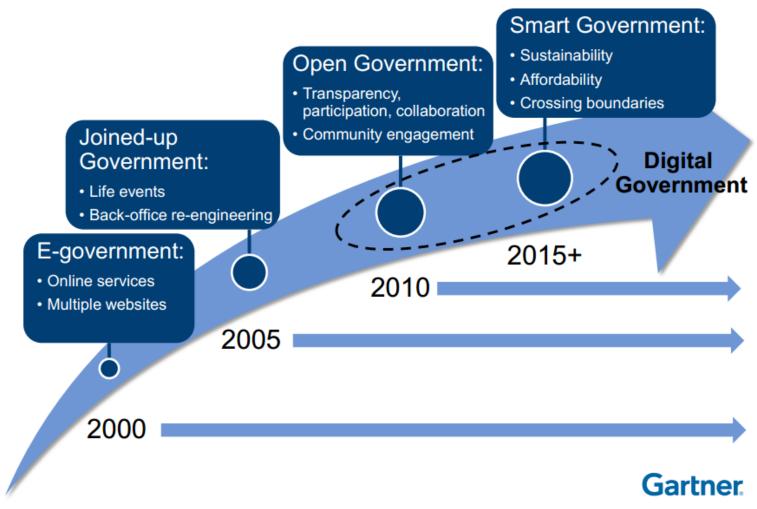
☐ Government data shall be considered open if it is made public in a way that complies with the principles below:

- 7) Non-proprietary
- 8) License-free

Four Phases of Technology in Government: Smart and Digital



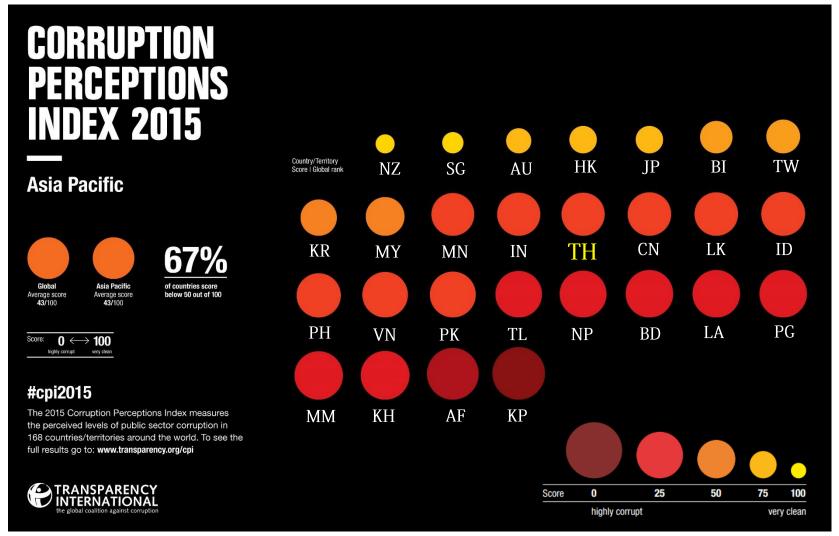

□ Cabinet Resolution on 23 April, 2013, EGA was assigned to be responsible for administrate Open Government Data website (data.go.th) and Government Application Center (apps.go.th)

Thailand Government Spending

- □ Resolution from National Counter Corruption Committee on 13 July, 2015 has driven Open Data through Licensing Facilitation Act 2015
- □ National Counter Corruption Committee agreed on providing open government data on one electronic channel (data.go.th) starting with Information of Thailand Government Spending

Open Government Partnership





OGP was launched in 2011 to provide an international platform for domestic reformers committed to making their governments more open, accountable, and responsive to citizens. Since then, OGP has grown from 8 countries to the 70 participating countries In all of these countries, government and civil society are working together to develop and implement ambitious open government reforms.

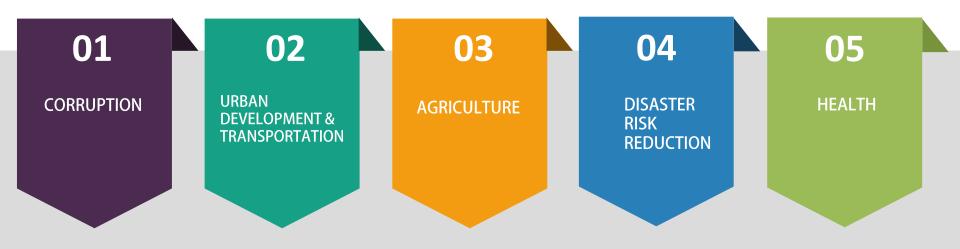

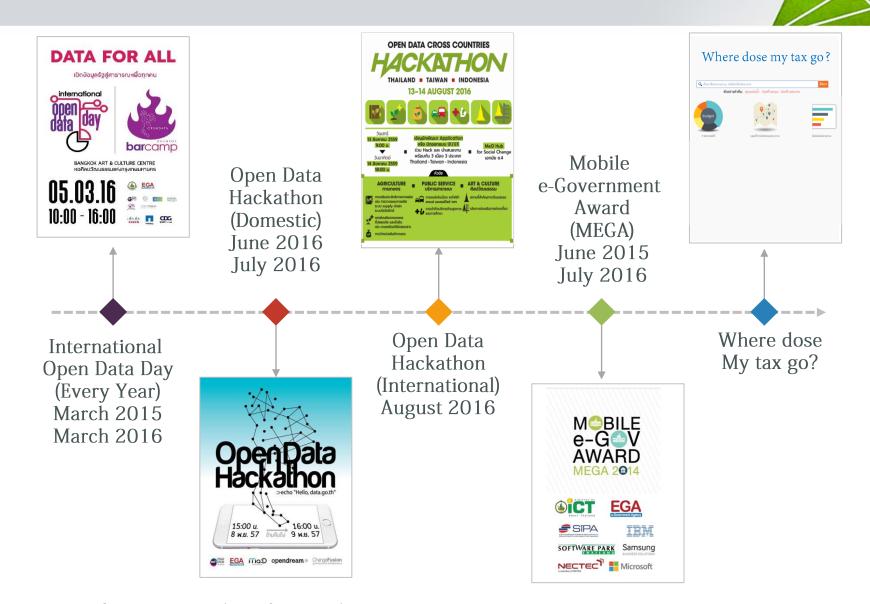


Data Community Engagement

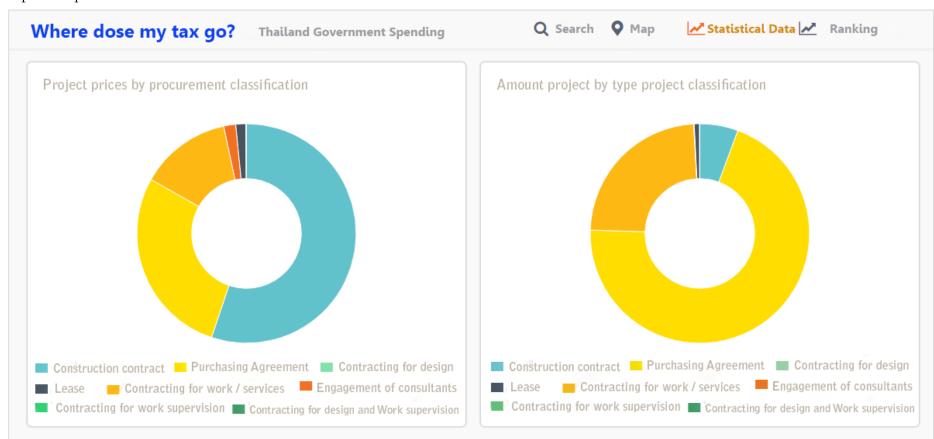
